

1100-1230	<p><b>Lancashire Sustainable Food Networking Session</b>  <b>LESS – Food Futures</b></p> <p><i>This 90 minute session will introduce the emerging Lancashire Food Alliance whilst creating plenty of time for exploring the range of sustainable food activities going on across the county.</i></p>
1100-1230	<p><b>Placemaking with Young Adults</b>  <b>Lancaster City Council &amp; Lancaster University</b></p> <p><i>Shaping the places we live, study and work in is one of the most powerful tools we have for climate adaptation, mitigation and long-term resilience. To explore this in practice, join Lancaster University, Lancaster City Council and participants of the Placemaking with Young Adults Program for a WALKshop around the University of Cumbria campus. Participants can try out Lancaster’s Placemaking Framework in real time and learn how the tool helps weave climate action into everyday placemaking, while also supporting inclusive, people-centred design. We’ll finish by exploring how participants might use the tool within their own roles and areas of work. 1400-1530	<p><b>North Lancashire is Golden LESS – Food Futures</b></p> <p><i>Join us for an interactive workshop exploring how North Lancashire can go for "Gold Sustainable Food Places." We'll share the latest progress from the "North Lancs is Golden" campaign, highlight community-led initiatives driving good food transformation, and identify practical actions organisations can take to accelerate the region towards the goal. Participants will collaborate on pledges for building a fair, resilient and climate-friendly local food system and leave with practical actions for staying involved.</i></p>
1400-1530	<p><b>Peoples Jury's across Lancashire Shared Future</b></p> <p><i>This interactive workshop explores how citizens' juries and citizens' assemblies can place citizen voice at the heart of our response to climate change. Bringing together former members of climate juries and assemblies from Lancashire and Cumbria, the session offers first-hand insight into how these processes work in practice and the difference they can make. Mark Davies, Chief Executive of Lancaster City Council, will reflect on how deliberative democratic processes sit within the context of local government reorganisation. The workshop will also examine the role and impact of citizens' assemblies, including permanent assemblies, across the UK and wider Europe, before inviting participants to discuss what role these approaches could play in shaping the future of climate decision-making in the county.</i></p>
1400-1530	<p><b>From Anxiety to Agency: Helping Young People Resist Climate Misinformation</b> <b>University of Cumbria</b></p> <p><i>Join this interactive session exploring a new project to counter climate misinformation among adolescents in Lancashire and Cumbria. Led by researchers from the Universities of Cumbria and Lancashire, participants will share insights and co-create ideas for emotion-focused interventions that build resilience, agency, and trust in science.</i></p>
