In recent months, LancsCAN Youth have been focusing on spreading awareness of how to meaningfully engage with young people within climate action conversations. This has included delivering a breakout session at the Lancashire Community Climate Action Forum in March, as well as presenting at a recent LancsCAN Lunch & Learn event.

As the group continues to build connections across the community, one of our priorities is to participate in more in-person activities, and to encourage other young people to do the same. We are therefore planning to take part in some outdoor volunteering activities with the Ribble Rivers Trust.

We will also soon be developing a survey to gain insight into the climate action priorities of young people in the Lancashire area. It is our hope to use the findings of this survey as a guideline for our future projects and actions, in an effort to make sure our work represents the interests of as many young people as possible. Please keep an eye out for further updates on this!

Finally, as the group continues to develop, LancsCAN Youth are beginning to recruit additional members. We would love to hear from young people aged 18-25 who are interested in joining our group, whether this is as a committee member with specific responsibilities, or as a more general group member. Lancashire Renewables is the company owned by Lancashire County Council and Blackpool Council which operates the two waste recovery plants in Lancashire. Eco Town is based in the Environmental Education Centre at Farington Waste Recovery Park.

What do we do?

We receive, treat and transport municipal waste for Lancashire. Our aim is to achieve a sustainable future for Lancashire by providing services to process biodegradable and non biodegradable household waste.

Types of waste

The waste that we receive includes residual (“black bin bag”) waste as well as kerbside collected recycling materials.

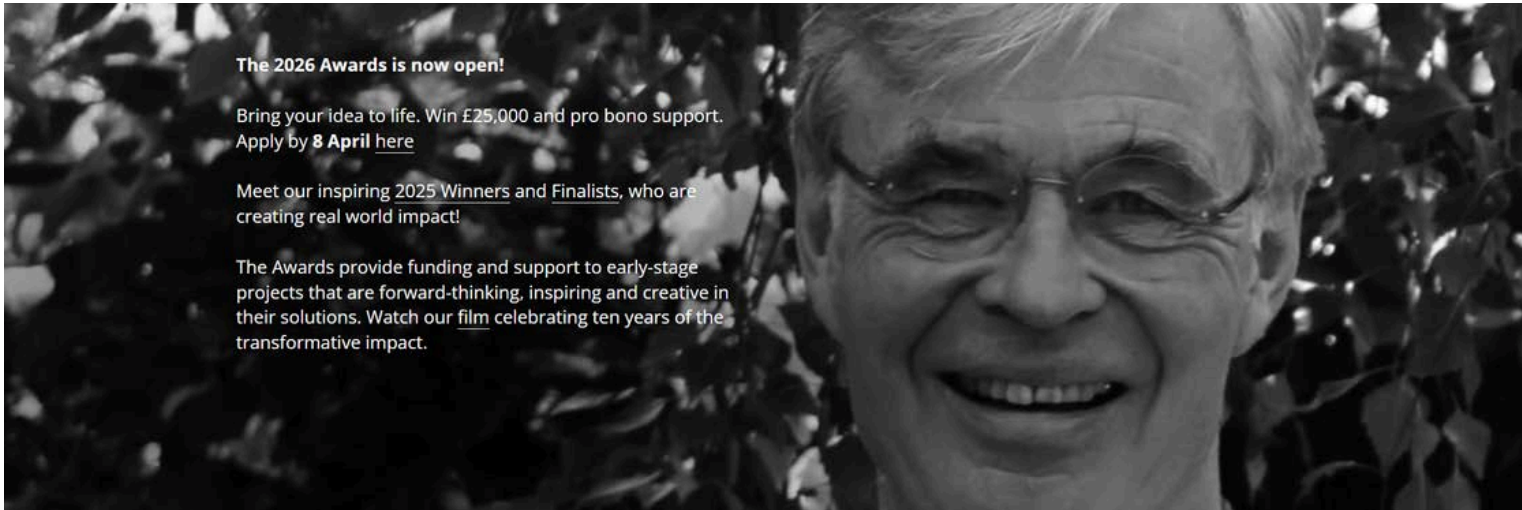

Stephen Lloyd Awards - Funding Opportunity

The aim of the Awards, is to help create success by finding and nurturing innovative ideas and projects that can lead to practical, sustainable social or environmental change. The Awards are particularly interested in supporting novel, early stage ideas that address social or environmental problems at a systemic level. These are essentially ‘big ideas’ that might not, or cannot, reach the mainstream channels for support or funding.

The heart of the Awards is the bringing together of experts that can deliver practical, free support to shortlisted candidates as well as Award winners, and in many ways, this is the biggest prize for those shortlisted. In addition, funding of £25,000 will be made available to support Award winners in developing their initiatives. At the shortlist stage the Awards will make up to ten awards of up to £2,500 to assist candidates to further develop their ideas.

Ideas may come in many forms. They may be a new start-up enterprise or an extension of an organisation’s existing work; however, preference will be given to entries originating from a start-up or early stage project, rather than initiated within a larger charity organisation. They might be a discrete piece of lobbying work or a high profile campaign; the aim might be to change policy or legislation or to create a new legal form or financial structure.

Who was Stephen?

Stephen Lloyd was an inspirational lawyer and innovator who dedicated his working life to advising charities and social enterprises and who pioneered significant developments in the sector. He died suddenly on 20th August 2014 while sailing in Newport Bay, a place that he loved dearly. The exact cause of his death is unknown. Stephen was widely known for his expertise, dynamism, creative intellect, wisdom, leadership, sense of fun and commitment to good causes, and his friends and admirers have established the Stephen Lloyd Awards to preserve and perpetuate the memory, ideals and legacy of such an extraordinary man.

Philosofun - Climate

Jane Yates and I first began collaborating on the Philosofun Concept back in 2020, wanting to find more ways to showcase the accessibility and ‘fun’ ness of Philosophy for Children and Communities (P4C). In P4C we so often refer to the 4C’s of P4C, in relation to the skills we are trying to develop with the groups that we work with – ‘Caring, Collaborative, Creative and Critical’. We were seeing a lot of Philosothon taking place, with their strong competitive elements, which prompted us to develop Philosofuns, focused on the Caring, Collaborative and of course fun elements of P4C. We can’t personally take credit for the name ‘Philosofun’ as it was developed in true Philosophy for Children (P4C) style through a collaborative dialogue shared with Pippa Leslie on a train journey back from a SAPERE P4C conference. Jane and I were describing to Pippa what we were trying to achieve and then Pippa summarised our thinking succinctly and Philosofuns was born!

Our first online Philosofun took place during the depths of COVID in May 2020, with a linked Philosofun theme to the times we lived in ‘Provisions’ and was attended by over 40 participants. We now regularly offer online, face to face (both in the indoor and outdoor classroom) whole school and open courses and can also of course offer sessions with pupils. <https://www.littlechatters.co.uk/forthcoming-courses>

So what is a Philosofun?

- Philosofuns are non-competitive, active, playful, engaging and fun!
- Short philosophical activities to ensure they can easily be slotted into the school day and can be expanded to full class sessions or even full day sessions if required – you can use or adapt our ideas straight to your classroom
- Activities to foster collaborative thinking through ‘micro-communities’ focused on small group conversations with potential to lead to a full class enquiry
